

AN ORDINANCE

To set the compensation of the Municipal Court Prosecuting Attorney per City Charter Sections 4.11(a)(5) and 6.6(b).

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MARIETTA HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1: Effective January 1, 2023, the compensation of the Municipal Court Prosecuting Attorney is set in the form of an annual salary payable in installments per city administrative procedures through the term of employment as eighty thousand two hundred four dollars and eighty cents (\$80,204.80). The signed employment agreement is on file with the City Clerk.


Section 2: It is hereby declared to be the intention of this Ordinance that its sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses and phrases are severable, and if any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is declared to be unconstitutional or invalid, it shall not affect any of the remaining sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases of this Ordinance.

Section 3: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4: This Ordinance shall become effective upon the signature or without the signature of the Mayor, subject to Georgia laws 1983, page 4119.
